No. 22 of 1929.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Theatres and Public Halls
Ordinance 1928.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Theatres and Public Halls Ordinance 1929*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Theatres and Public Halls Ordinance 1928*, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Theatres and Public Halls Ordinance 1928-1929*.

2. After section twenty-five of the *Theatres and Public Halls Ordinance 1928*, the following section is inserted:—

“ 25A.—(1.) All halls, corridors, passages, stairs, exit doors, courts and other means of exit from a theatre shall be free from all obstructions and all exit doors shall be unlocked and available for the public at any interval during, and at the conclusion of, any performance. Opening of doors of theatres.

“(2.) The owner, lessee or sub-lessee of any theatre who fails to allow the public to leave the theatre by all exit doors at any interval during a performance shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Twenty pounds.”
