## AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932*.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1937*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932-1937*.

2. After section four of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

“4A. The owner of any animal which is found straying, wandering, or at large on any road or on any unleased land belonging to the Commonwealth shall be guilty of an offence. Animals straying, &c., on Commonwealth lands.

Penalty: Ten pounds.”.
