AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY.

No. 39 of 1938.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Plant Diseases Ordinance 1934-1938.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Ordinance (No. 2) 1938*. Short title and citation.

(2.) Sub-section (3.) of section one of the *Plant Diseases Ordinance 1938* is repealed.

(3.) The *Plant Diseases Ordinance 1934-1936*, as amended by the *Plant Diseases Ordinance 1938*, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(4.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Plant Diseases Ordinance 1934-1938*.

2. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Definitions.

(a) by inserting before the definition of "Disease" the following definition:—

“ ‘Director-General’ means the Director-General of Works;” ; and

(b) by omitting the definitions of “Minister” and “Secretary”.
