PHARMACY ORDINANCE 1972

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1972*.*

Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1971*,† as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1972*.

2. Section 46 of the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1971* is amended by omitting from sub-section (1.) the words “, or for preventing conception”.
