An Act to amend the Emergencies Act 2004

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1	Name of Act
	This Act is the Emergencies (Bushfire Reporting) Amendment Act 2009.

	This Act commences on the day after its notification day.
