NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Bott Crescent	Lloyd Forrester Bott CBE, DSC (1917-2004)	Australian public service 1933-1977. Secretary of the Department of National Development, Secretary of the Department of Tourism and Recreation and Secretary of the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. Awarded DSC for World War II naval service in the English Channel.
Deasey Close	Maude Kathleen Deasey (1909-1968)	Administrator, public servant and educator. Assistant-controller Australian Women's Army Service (1941-47), officer of Department of Immigration responsible for placement of migrant families, teacher and university college principal.
Kevin Curtis Crescent	Kevin John Curtis (1924-2004)	Australian public service 1939 to 1983. Served with the Postmaster-General's Department, Department of Customs and Excise. Retired as Secretary-Manager of the National Capital Development Commission.
Loomes Lane	Allan Henry Loomes OBE (1917-1990)	Public service with the NSW government and after wartime RAAF service joined the Commonwealth Department of External Affairs in 1946. Served as Ambassador to Burma, Thailand, South Korea, Peru and Venezuela in a 31-year career.
Macandie Street	George Lionel Macandie CBE (1877-1968)	Queensland and Australian public service 1896-1946. Helped set up Navy Office in Melbourne from 1903. Secretary of the Australian Commonwealth Naval Board from 1914 to 1946.
Minty Grove	Albert Ernest (Bill) Minty (1921-1995)	Australian public service as project engineer with the National Capital Development Commission 1959-1982. Involved in the creation of Lake Burley Griffin and several other major civil engineering Canberra projects.
Pickup Close	Allan Sydney Pickup (1916-2001)	Australian public service (1939-1947 and 1957-1977). Australian engineer assigned to jet engine development in the UK during World War II. Later responsible for installation and maintenance of mechanical components in Canberra's government buildings.

Seery Street	Eva Letitia Seery (1899-2000)	Australian public service 1918-1963. Awarded the Imperial Service Medal in 1963 for faithful service to the Commonwealth as a typiste, stenographer and supervisor within the Repatriation Department.
Victoria Owen Circuit	Victoria Mary Owen (1949-2008)	Australian public service and diplomat. Ambassador to Syria and Lebanon (1990-1992) and to the Arab Republic of Egypt. Accredited to Sudan and Tunisia (1998-2001). Recognised for her expertise in Middle Eastern affairs. Member of the Arab-Australia Institute and the Australia-Syria Business Council.
