# THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 7 of 1927.

## AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the Meat Ordinance 1920-1926.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Meat Ordinance 1927*. Short title and citation.

(2.) In this Ordinance the *Meat Ordinance 1920-1926* is referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Meat Ordinance 1920-1927*.

2. Section seven of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section is inserted in its stead:— Importation of meat prohibited.

“7. Any person who, except in accordance with such conditions as are prescribed or as are notified in the *Gazette* by the Federal Capital Commission, brings into the Territory or causes to be brought into the Territory for the purposes of sale or any business carried on by him or any other person, any meat which does not bear a prescribed brand, shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.”
