

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 6 of 1930.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the *Liquor Ordinance 1929*.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1930*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance 1929* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1930*.

2. This Ordinance shall commence on the same date as the Principal Ordinance. Commencement.

3. Section twenty of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by omitting from sub-section (3.) the word “ Ten ” and inserting in its stead the word “ Five ”; Licence fee payable for Residential Hotel Licence.

(b) by inserting in sub-section (3.) after the word “ renewed ”, the words “ or Fifty pounds, whichever is the greater ”; and

(c) by adding at the end of sub-section (3.) the following proviso:—

“ Provided that, where a licence has not been in force during the whole of the twelve months immediately preceding the application, the licence-fee payable by any such licensee on the renewal of a Residential Hotel Licence shall be Fifty pounds.”.
