AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Dogs Registration Ordinance 1926-1933.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933, as follows:—

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Dogs Registration* Short title and citation
- (2.) The *Dogs Registration Ordinance* 1926-1933 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Dogs Registration Ordinance* 1926-1934.
- 2. Section nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the proviso and inserting in its stead the following provisoes:—

"Provided that where a person satisfies the Registrar that he is the keeper of a number of dogs (exceeding two) kept or used together for the purposes of a trade or business carried on by the keeper, or for the purpose of herding sheep, droving cattle or other animals, or destroying rabbits, dingoes or foxes, the fee payable to the Registrar shall be Ten shillings in respect of all such dogs:

Provided further that where the form of notice referred to in section seven of this Ordinance is delivered after the thirty-first day of December in any year, only half the fee shall be payable.".
