AN ORDINANCE

To suspend certain provisions of the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1938 relating to Special Permits during the present war and for a limited time thereafter.

- BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1940, as follows:—
- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor (Suspension of citation. Special Permits) Ordinance 1942.*
- **2.** The operation of sub-sections (1.) to (5.) inclusive and of suspension of paragraph (ii) of sub-section (8.) of section thirty of the *Liquor* provisions *Ordinance* 1929-1938 is suspended until a date to be fixed by the *Ordinance* or *Liquor* provisions. Minister by notice in the Gazette, and no longer, but in any event 1929-1938. not longer than twelve months after His Majesty ceases to be engaged in war.
