## AN ORDINANCE

**To suspend certain provisions of the Liquor Ordinance 1929-1938 relating to Special Permits during the present war and for a limited time thereafter.**

**B**E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1940*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Suspension of Special Permits) Ordinance 1942*.<sup>\*</sup> Citation.

2. The operation of sub-sections (1.) to (5.) inclusive and of paragraph (ii) of sub-section (8.) of section thirty of the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1938* is suspended until a date to be fixed by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette*, and no longer, but in any event not longer than twelve months after His Majesty ceases to be engaged in war.
