No. 19 of 1937.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Tobacco Ordinance 1927-1936.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Tobacco Ordinance 1937*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Tobacco Ordinance 1927-1936* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Tobacco Ordinance 1927-1937*.

2. Section three of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting after the definition of "Shop" the following definition:— Definitions.

"'Shopkeeper' means a person or partnership occupying a shop, directly or indirectly, as principal;".

3. Section four of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:— Deputy Registrar of Tobacco Licences.

"(3.) The Minister may appoint an officer to be Deputy Registrar of Tobacco Licences, and the person so appointed shall have and may exercise all the powers and functions of the Registrar, except the powers and functions conferred by section eighteen of this Ordinance."

4. After section twelve of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

"12A. Any shopkeeper who causes, suffers or permits to be sold in his shop any tobacco, cigars or cigarettes shall, unless he is the holder of a licence in respect of the shop, be guilty of an offence. Sale of tobacco, Ac., by shopkeeper.

Penalty: Twenty pounds."
