## AN ORDINANCE

## To amend the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1949.

E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938 and the Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947, as follows:—

- 1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be sited as the Court of Petty short title and citation Sessions Ordinance 1951.\*
- (2.) The Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1949 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the Court of Petty Sessions Ordinance 1930-1951.
- 2. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Definitions. omitting from the definition of "Magistrate" the words "Magistrate or Special Magistrate" and inserting in their stead the words "stipendiary magistrate or special magistrate".
  - **3**. Section seven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by—

Appointment of stipendiary

- (a) omitting from paragraph (a) of sub-section (1.) the magistrates word "magistrates" and inserting in its stead the and officers. words "stipendiary magistrates"; and
- (b) omitting from sub-section (2.) the word "magistrate" and inserting in its stead the words "stipendiary magistrate".
- **4.** Λ person holding office as a magistrate under section seven continuance of the Principal Ordinance immediately prior to the date of of appointment. commencement of this Ordinance shall be deemed to have been appointed a stipendiary magistrate under section seven of the Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance, and shall,

unless otherwise determined by the Governor-General, be paid the same remuneration, and hold office on the same terms and conditions, as were applicable to him immediately prior to that date.
