About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Holidays Act 1958* as in force on 14 January 2002. It includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 12 September 2001 and any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes).

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The Legislation Act 2001, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see Legislation Act 2001, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol $\boxed{\textbf{U}}$ appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

Holidays Act 1958

An Act to make provision with respect to public holidays and bank holidays

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Holidays Act 1958.

3 Public holidays

- (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3)—
 - (a) in any year each of the following days in that year shall be observed as a public holiday in the Territory:
 - (i) 1 January (New Year's day), or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (ii) 26 January (Australia Day), or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (iii) the third Monday in March (Canberra Day);
 - (iv) Good Friday;
 - (v) the Saturday following Good Friday;
 - (vi) the Monday following Good Friday;
 - (vii) 25 April (Anzac Day), or, if that day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (viii) the second Monday in June (the day for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of the Sovereign);
 - (ix) the first Monday in October (Labour Day);
 - (x) Christmas Day, or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (xi) 26 December (Boxing Day), or—
 - (A) if that day falls on a Saturday—the following Monday; or
 - (B) if that day falls on a Sunday or Monday—the following Tuesday; and

- (b) any other day, or a part of any other day, declared by the Minister, in writing, to be a public holiday in the Territory or in a part of the Territory specified in the declaration shall be observed as such in the Territory or that part of the Territory, as the case may be.
- (2) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, it is expedient that a day referred to in subsection (1) (a) should not, in a particular year, be observed as a public holiday in the Territory, the Minister may, in writing, declare that that day shall not, in that year, be so observed and that declaration has effect accordingly.
- (3) A declaration under subsection (1) (b) or (2) is a notifiable instrument.
 - Note A notifiable instrument must be notified under the Legislation Act 2001.
- (4) A declaration under subsection (2) in relation to a day must be notified under the *Legislation Act 2001* not later than 1 week before the day.
- (5) When, but for this subsection, a person would be entitled under an award to observe as a holiday a weekday (being a day that is not to be observed as a public holiday in the Territory under this Act) following a substituted public holiday, the provisions of this Act by virtue of which that substituted public holiday is to be observed as a public holiday in the Territory do not apply in relation to that person.
- (6) In subsection (5):

award—see the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (Cwlth), section 4.

substituted public holiday means a day that, under subsection (1), is to be observed as a public holiday in the Territory by reason only that another day or date specified in subsection (1) (a) falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

4 Bank holidays

(1) Subject to subsection (2)—

- (a) any day, or part of a day, that in any year is observed as a public holiday in the Territory or a part of the Territory by virtue of section 3 is a bank holiday in the Territory or that part of the Territory, as the case may be; and
- (b) the first Monday in August of each year is a bank holiday in the Territory; and
- (c) any other day, or a part of any other day, declared by the Minister, in writing, to be a bank holiday in the Territory or in a part of the Territory specified in the declaration is a bank holiday in the Territory or that part of the Territory, as the case may be.
- (2) Where, in the opinion of the Minister, it is expedient that a day referred to in subsection (1) (a) or (b) should not, in a particular year, be a bank holiday, the Minister may, in writing, declare that that day is not, in that year, a bank holiday and that declaration has effect accordingly.
- (3) A declaration under subsection (1) (c) or (2) is a notifiable instrument.
 - *Note* A notifiable instrument must be notified under the *Legislation Act 2001*.
- (4) A declaration under subsection (2) in relation to a day must be notified under the *Legislation Act 2001* not later than 1 week before the day.

5 Union picnic day

In any year, the first Monday in March shall be observed as a holiday in the Territory by employees whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by an award specified in schedule 1.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnotes.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.

3 Legislation history

The *Holidays Act 1958* was originally the *Holidays Ordinance 1958*. It became an ACT Act on self-government (11 May 1989).

Before 11 May 1989, ordinances commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910* (Cwlth), s 12).

After 11 May 1989 and before 10 November 1999, Acts commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth) s 25).
