About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Holidays Act 1958* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 11 January 2006. It also includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 11 January 2006.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the Legislation Act 2001 applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol $\boxed{\mathbf{U}}$ appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

An Act to make provision with respect to public holidays and bank holidays

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Holidays Act 1958.

3 Public holidays

- (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (5)—
 - (a) in any year each of the following days in that year is a public holiday in the ACT:
 - (i) 1 January (New Year's day), or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (ii) 26 January (Australia Day), or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (iii) the 3rd Monday in March (Canberra Day);
 - (iv) Good Friday;
 - (v) the Saturday following Good Friday;
 - (vi) the Monday following Good Friday;
 - (vii) 25 April (Anzac Day), or, if that day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (viii) the 2nd Monday in June (the day for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of the Sovereign);
 - (ix) the 1st Monday in October (Labour Day);
 - (x) Christmas Day, or, if that day falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday;
 - (xi) 26 December (Boxing Day), or—
 - (A) if that day falls on a Saturday—the following Monday; or
 - (B) if that day falls on a Sunday or Monday—the following Tuesday; and

- (b) any other day, or a part of any other day, that the Minister declares to be a public holiday in the ACT, or in a part of the ACT stated in the declaration, is a public holiday in the ACT or that part of the ACT.
- (2) If the Minister considers it is appropriate that a day mentioned in subsection (1) (a) should not, in a particular year, be a public holiday in the ACT, the Minister may declare that the day is not, in that year, a public holiday.
- (3) A declaration under subsection (1) (b) or (2) is a notifiable instrument.

Note A notifiable instrument must be notified under the Legislation Act.

- (4) A declaration under subsection (2) in relation to a day must be notified under the Legislation Act not later than 1 week before the day.
- (5) If a person who is entitled under an award to a holiday on a weekday following a substituted public holiday and the weekday is not a public holiday under this Act, the substituted public holiday is not a public holiday for the person under this Act.
- (6) In subsection (5):

award—see the Workplace Relations Act 1996 (Cwlth), section 4.

substituted public holiday means a day that is a public holiday because another day mentioned in subsection (1) (a) is a Saturday or Sunday.

4 Bank holidays

- (1) Subject to subsection (2)—
 - (a) any day, or part of a day, that in any year is a public holiday in the ACT or a part of the ACT under section 3 is a bank holiday in the ACT or that part of the ACT; and
 - (b) the 1st Monday in August of each year is a bank holiday in the ACT; and

- (c) any other day, or a part of any other day that the Minister declares to be a bank holiday in the ACT, or in a part of the ACT stated in the declaration, is a bank holiday in the ACT or that part of the ACT.
- (2) If the Minister considers it is appropriate that a day mentioned in subsection (1) (a) or (b) should not, in a particular year, be a bank holiday in the ACT, the Minister may declare that the day is not, in that year, a bank holiday.
- (3) A declaration under subsection (1) (c) or (2) is a notifiable instrument.

Note A notifiable instrument must be notified under the Legislation Act.

(4) A declaration under subsection (2) in relation to a day must be notified under the Legislation Act not later than 1 week before the day.

5 Union picnic day

In any year, the 1st Monday in March is a holiday in the ACT for employees whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by an award mentioned in schedule 1.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

3 Legislation history

This Act was originally a Commonwealth ordinance—the *Holidays Ordinance* 1958 No 19 (Cwlth).

The Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988 (Cwlth), s 34 (4) converted most former Commonwealth ordinances in force in the ACT into ACT enactments. This allowed the ACT Legislative Assembly to amend and repeal the laws. This Act was converted into an ACT enactment on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

As with most ordinances in force in the ACT, the name was changed from *Ordinance* to *Act* by the *Self-Government (Citation of Laws) Act 1989* No 21, s 5 on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

Before 11 May 1989, ordinances commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910* (Cwlth), s 12).

After 11 May 1989 and before 10 November 1999, Acts commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act* 1988 (Cwlth) s 25).
