# A2017-41

An Act to amend legislation in relation to the Legislative Assembly and officers of the Legislative Assembly

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

# Part 1 Preliminary

## 1 Name of Act

This Act is the Legislative Assembly Legislation Amendment Act 2017.

### 2 Commencement

This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

*Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

- Electoral Act 1992
- Financial Management Act 1996
- Legislative Assembly (Office of the Legislative Assembly) Act 2012

      - (B) another area that is relevant to and consistent with the functions of a member of the electoral commission; and
  - (b) the relevant Assembly committee agrees to the person's appointment.

- (a) the Office of the Legislative Assembly; or
- (b) another entity that is able to provide impartial administrative support or advice.
