# SCHEDULE OATH AND AFFIRMATION OF OFFICE

An Act to provide for the appointment of justices of the peace consequentially upon the repeal of the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930* 

### **Short title**

1. This Act may be cited as the Justices of the Peace Act 1989.

### Commencement

**2.** (1) Section 1 and this section commence on the day on which this Act is notified in the *Gazette*.

(2) The remaining provisions commence on the date of commencement of section 22 of the *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* of the Commonwealth.

## **Appointments**

- **3.** (1) The Minister may, by instrument, appoint such justices of the peace as he or she thinks fit.
- (2) Before commencing to perform the duties of his or her office, a justice of the peace appointed under subsection (1) shall take an oath of office, or make an affirmation of office, before a Judge of the Supreme Court, in accordance with the relevant form in the Schedule.

## Register

- **4.** (1) The Registrar of the Supreme Court shall keep a register to be known as "The Register of Justices of the Peace of the Australian Capital Territory".
- (2) Upon the appointment of a justice of the peace, the Registrar shall enter his or her name in the register.
- (3) The Registrar shall strike off the register the name of a person whose appointment as a justice of the peace has ceased.

#### **Appointments—saving**

**5.** A person who was, immediately before the commencement of section 3, appointed, or to be deemed to have been appointed, as a justice of the peace under the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance 1930* shall be deemed to have been appointed under section 3 of this Act upon that commencement.

## Register—saving

6. The Register of Justices of the Peace of the Australian Capital Territory kept under section 17 of the *Seat of Government (Administration) Ordinance* 1930 immediately before the date of commencement of section 4 of this Act shall be deemed to be a part of the register kept under section 4 of this Act.
