Definition of Class A and Class B units

Two types of units are described in the Unit Titles Act -Class A and Class B units.

The boundaries of Class A units are defined by the floors, walls and ceilings of the units. Ancillary land or buildings, such as a garage or courtyard may be subsidiaries of a unit. Examples of Class A units are the Kingston Tower and the Capital Tower.

Class B units are not limited by vertical dimensions. They are often in single storey clusters.

Some unit developments (except for two unit residential) may be built in stages which enables the developer to sell some completed units while others are under construction.
