

Form 3.25 Notice of renunciation of letters of administration in favour of public trustee

In the Supreme Court of the Australian Capital Territory

Probate jurisdiction

4. *[I/We] renounce all right to letters of administration of the estate of the deceased person in favour of the public trustee.
