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Name of Act

This Act is the Crimes Amendment Act 2001.

4 2 Commencement

This Act commences on the day it is notified in the Gazette.

92NC Using the Internet etc to deprave young people

(1) A person must not, using electronic means, suggest to a young person that the young person commit or take part in, or watch someone else committing or taking part in, an act of a sexual nature.

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1		Maximum penalty:
2		(a) for a 1st offence—imprisonment for 5 years; or
3		(b) for a 2nd or subsequent offence—imprisonment for 10 years.

8 9	(2)	A person must not, using electronic means, send or make available pornographic material to a young person.
10 11		Maximum penalty: 100 penalty units, imprisonment for 5 years or both.
