## Subordinate Laws (Amendment) Bill 1999

---

### A BILL

FOR

#### An Act to amend the *Subordinate Laws Act 1989*

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

**1 Short title**

This Act is the *Subordinate Laws (Amendment) Act 1999*.

**5 2 Commencement**

This Act commences on the day it is notified in the *Gazette*.

**3 Act amended**

This Act amends the *Subordinate Laws Act 1989*.<sup>1</sup>

**4 Notification, tabling and disallowance**

**10** Section 6 is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection (7) “15” and substituting “6”; and
- (b) by omitting from subsections (7A) and (7B) “15” (wherever occurring) and substituting “6”; and

(c) by omitting from subsection (11) "15" and substituting "6".

**5 Addition**

The Act is amended by adding at the end the following section:

**5 "11 Transitional provision—change of tabling and  
disallowance period etc**

"(1) Section 6 as in force immediately before the commencement of this section continues to apply to a subordinate law (within the meaning of that section) that was notified in the *Gazette* before the commencement.

10 "(2) The reference in subsection (1) to section 6 includes a reference to that section as applied by section 10.

"(3) This section ceases to have effect 1 year after the day it commences."
