

8 The *Financial Relations Agreement Act 2000* gave effect to a commitment under the *1999* 9 *Intergovernmental Agreement on the Reform of Commonwealth-State Financial Relations.* This 10 agreement was superseded by the *2008 Intergovernmental Agreement on Federal Financial* 11 *Relations.* Obligations under the 1999 agreement have now been met and the Act is now 12 redundant.

13 The operation of the Act is spent. The 2008 agreement commenced on 1 January 2009 and 14 does not require legislation to give it effect.

4 This part repeals an Act that is no longer needed.

The Act provided for the approval and implementation of an interstate agreement about the water, land and other environmental resources of the Murray-Darling Basin. This agreement has been superseded by a new agreement, which is now incorporated into the *Water Act 2007* (Cwlth), schedule 1. The new agreement established the Murray-Darling Basin Authority

9 which is a Commonwealth agency, instead of a joint State-Commonwealth body.
