# **Animal Welfare (Factory Farming) Amendment Bill 2013**

## A Bill for

An Act to amend the Animal Welfare Act 1992, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

2	1	Name of Act
3 4		This Act is the Animal Welfare (Factory Farming) Amendment Act 2013.
5	2	Commencement
6		This Act commences on the day after its notification day.
7 8		Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

0			appropriate accommodation, for a pig kept by a person, means accommodation—
2			(a) that allows the pig to—
3			(i) turn around, stand up and lie down without difficulty; and
4 5			(ii) have a clean, comfortable and adequately drained place in which it can lie down; and
6			(iii) maintain a comfortable temperature; and
7			(iv) have outdoor access; and
8			(b) if the accommodation is for more than 1 pig—that allows each pig in the accommodation to lie down at the same time; and
20 21			(c) if the person keeps more than 1 pig—that allows the pig to see another pig except if—
22 23			(i) the pig is isolated on the advice of a veterinary surgeon; or

5		This part expires on 16 May 2016.
6 7 8		Note Transitional provisions are kept in the Act for a limited time. A transitional provision is repealed on its expiry but continues to have effect after its repeal (see Legislation Act, s 88).
