A Bill for

An Act to amend legislation about the streetlight network, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **Part 1 Preliminary**

2 **1 Name of Act**

3 This Act is the *Utilities (Streetlight Network) Legislation*
4 *Amendment Act 2017*.

5 **2 Commencement**

6 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

7 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on
8 the notification day (see [Legislation Act](#), s 75 (1)).

9 **3 Legislation amended**

10 This Act amends the following legislation:

4 **6 Application of AS/NZS 3000 to streetlight network**

5 (1) This section applies to the streetlight network.

6 (2) The streetlight network is taken to comply with AS/NZS 3000 if the
7 streetlight network complies with a specific design and installation
8 method in AS/NZS 3000, part 1, whether or not AS/NZS 3000,
9 part 2 can be met.

10 (3) In this section:

11 *streetlight network*—see the *Utilities Act 2000*, section 229.

109A Notice to owner of structure—network operations

- (1) This section applies to network operations on infrastructure owned by a utility and installed in a structure owned by the Territory.
- (2) At least 7 days before beginning network operations, the utility must give the Territory written notice of the proposed operations.

Note For how documents may be given, see the [Legislation Act](#), pt 19.5.

- (3) The notice must—

(a) so far as practicable, state the following matters:

- (i) the purpose of the operations;
- (ii) the nature of the activities involved;
- (iii) the structure to be accessed;
- (iv) the period or periods during which the operations are expected to be carried out; and

(b) state the utility's obligations under this part.

Note The utility's obligations include taking all reasonable steps to ensure that it causes as little inconvenience, detriment and damage as is practicable (see s 108), removing its property and waste (see s 112) and restoring the land (see s 113).

- (4) The Territory may, in writing, agree to a notice period of less than 7 days.

- 1 (5) However, there is no notice period for network operations carried
2 out—
- 3 (a) in urgent circumstances in which it is necessary to protect—
- 4 (i) the integrity of a territory network or territory network
5 facility; or
- 6 (ii) the health or safety of people; or
- 7 (iii) public or private property; or
- 8 (iv) the environment; or
- 9 (b) for streetlight network infrastructure—in accordance with an
10 access agreement between the utility and the Territory, made
11 under a streetlight network code.

13 **229A Streetlight network framework**

14 (1) The Minister may approve a framework for the interaction between
15 the streetlight network and the electricity network (the *streetlight*
16 *network framework*).

17 (2) The Minister may only approve a streetlight network framework if
18 the electricity distributor agrees to the framework.

19 (3) The streetlight network framework must not limit the operation of
20 any other Act or any other legal right.

21 (4) An approved streetlight network framework is a notifiable
22 instrument.

23 *Note* A notifiable instrument must be notified under the [Legislation Act](#).

1 **229B Draft streetlight network code**

2 (1) The director-general may prepare a draft streetlight network code
3 for this part.

4 (2) The draft streetlight network code may set out the following:

5 (a) arrangements for the interaction between the Territory and
6 another entity in relation to the streetlight network, including
7 the following:

8 (i) the Territory's access to infrastructure owned by the
9 Territory that is installed in a structure not owned by the
10 Territory;

11 (ii) an entity's access to infrastructure owned by the entity
12 that is installed in a structure owned by the Territory;

13 (iii) resolving disputes in relation to the arrangement;

14 (b) arrangements in relation to the appointment of a territory
15 service authorised person for the streetlight network;

16 *Note* The director-general may appoint a person as a territory service
17 authorised person (see s 242 (1) (a)).

18 (c) arrangements for protecting the following in relation to the
19 streetlight network:

20 (i) the health or safety of people, including people carrying
21 out work on the streetlight network;

22 (ii) public and private property;

23 (iii) the environment;

24 (d) arrangements for the implementation of a streetlight network
25 framework;

26 (e) infrastructure, including a class of infrastructure, to be
27 excluded from the streetlight network;

- 1 (f) any other matter necessary or convenient to give effect to this
2 part.
- 3 (3) The draft streetlight network code must not limit the operation of
4 any other Act or any other legal right.
- 5 (4) The director-general—
- 6 (a) must give a copy of the draft streetlight network code to—
- 7 (i) the construction occupations registrar; and
- 8 (ii) each regulated utility providing services that are likely to
9 be effected by the operation and maintenance of the
10 streetlight network; and
- 11 (b) may give a copy of the draft streetlight network code to a
12 person the director-general believes has an interest in the
13 streetlight network.
- 14 (5) A person who is given any copy of the draft streetlight network code
15 under subsection (4) may make a submission to the director-general
16 about the draft streetlight network code within a stated period of not
17 less than 20 days.
- 18 (6) The director-general—
- 19 (a) must consider a submission made under this section; and
- 20 (b) may make a recommendation to the Minister about approval of
21 the draft streetlight network code.

22 **230 Streetlight network code approval**

- 23 (1) The Minister may approve a draft streetlight network code as
24 recommended by the director-general under section 229B (6) if the
25 Minister is satisfied on reasonable grounds that—
- 26 (a) section 229B has been complied with; and

1 (b) the streetlight network code is consistent with the objects of
2 this Act.

3 (2) An approved streetlight network code is a notifiable instrument.

4 *Note* A notifiable instrument must be notified under the [Legislation Act](#).

5 **12 Installation of territory network facilities**

15 **New section 235A****235A** **Notice to owner of structure—territory network operations**

(1) This section applies to territory network operations on infrastructure owned by the Territory and installed in a structure not owned by the Territory, if the structure is on territory land.

(2) At least 7 days before beginning territory network operations, the Territory must give the owner of the structure written notice of the proposed operations.

Note For how documents may be given, see the [Legislation Act](#), pt 19.5.

(3) The notice must—

(a) so far as practicable, state the following matters:

(i) the purpose of the operations;

(ii) the nature of the activities involved;

(iii) the structure to be accessed;

(iv) the period or periods during which the operations are expected to be carried out; and

(b) state the Territory's obligations under this part.

Note The Territory's obligations include taking all reasonable steps to ensure that it causes as little inconvenience, detriment and damage as is practicable (see s 234), removing its property and waste (see s 239) and restoring the land (see s 240).

(4) The owner of the structure may, in writing, agree to a notice period of less than 7 days.

- 1 (5) However, there is no notice period for territory network operations
2 carried out—
- 3 (a) in urgent circumstances in which it is necessary to protect—
- 4 (i) the integrity of a territory network or territory network
5 facility; or
- 6 (ii) the health or safety of people; or
- 7 (iii) public or private property; or
- 8 (iv) the environment; or
- 9 (b) in accordance with an access agreement between the Territory
10 and the owner of the structure, made under a streetlight
11 network code.

12 **16 Section 242**

14 **242 Territory service authorised people**

- 15 (1) Each of the following is a territory service authorised person for this
16 part:
- 17 (a) a person appointed by the director-general;
- 18 (b) a person appointed by an entity if—
- 19 (i) the Territory engages the entity to exercise a function
20 under this part; and
- 21 (ii) the director-general is satisfied that the entity has
22 appropriate arrangements in place for authorising a
23 person as a service authorised person for this part.

1 (2) A territory service authorised person must exercise the person's
2 functions under this part in accordance with the conditions of
3 appointment (if any) and any direction given to the person by the
4 appointer.

5 (3) In this section:

6 *appointer*, for a territory service authorised person, means—

7 (a) the director-general; or

8 (b) for a person appointed under subsection (1) (b)—the entity that
9 appointed the person.
