# **Work Health and Safety Legislation Amendment Bill 2017**

---

## **A Bill for**

An Act to amend legislation about dangerous substances and work health and safety, and for other purposes

---

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **Part 1 Preliminary**

2 **1 Name of Act**

3 This Act is the *Work Health and Safety Legislation Amendment Act*  
4 *2017*.

5 **2 Commencement**

6 This Act commences on 29 March 2018.

7 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on  
8 the notification day (see [Legislation Act](#), s 75 (1)).

9 **3 Legislation amended**

10 This Act amends the *Dangerous Substances Act 2004* and the *Work*  
11 *Health and Safety Act 2011*.

12 *Note* This Act also amends other legislation (see sch 1).
