# Education (Early Childhood) Legislation Amendment Bill 2023

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## A Bill for

An Act to amend legislation about education, and for other purposes

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The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

3 This Act is the *Education (Early Childhood) Legislation Amendment*
