STATUTE NO. 2

ACADEMIC PROGRESS STATUTE 1990

Citation

This Statute may be referred to as the <u>Academic Progress Statute</u> 1990.
Repeal

2. The <u>Academic Progress Statute</u> (Statute No. 6 of the Canberra College of Advanced Education) is repealed.

Definitions

3. In this Statute:

"Academic Board" means the Academic Board of the University;
"Faculty Board" means the Board of Studies of a Faculty of the University;

"student" means a person (including a person employed by the University) who has been admitted to a course of study at the University.

Academic progress rules

- (1) The Council may make rules, not inconsistent with the Act or a Statute, dealing with the academic progress of students.
 - (2) Rules made under subsection (1) may provide for the Academic Board or a Faculty Board acting in accordance with guidelines determined by the Academic Board:
 - (a) to review the academic progress of a student; and
 - (b) to take action in respect of a student whose academic progress in a course of study, or in a unit of a course of study, is found to be unsatisfactory by the Academic Board, or the Faculty Board, as the case may be, including:
 - (i) prohibiting the student from continuing with, or taking, any course of study or any unit of a course of study, or taking any examination in such a course or unit; or
 - (ii) prohibiting the student from continuing with, or taking, any course of study, or any unit of a course of study, or taking any examination in such a course or unit, otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as are specified in the direction.

Rules may provide for Academic Board to review decision of Faculty Boards

5. Rules made under section 4 that empower a Faculty Board to take action in respect of a student may also provide for the review, by the Academic Board, of any decision by the Faculty Board to take action in respect of the student.

Saving

6. Rules made under the <u>Academic Progress Statute</u> (Statute No. 6) that were in force immediately before the commencement of this Statute have effect, after that commencement, as if they were rules made by the Council under section 4 of this Statute.
