Charles Throsby (1777-1828)

SIGNIFICANCE

Explorer, Surgeon, Magistrate, Pastoralist. Road Builder. Politician. Born near Leicester, England, he came to Australia in 1802 as a surgeon in the "Coromandel". From 1802-1804 he was surgeon and magistrate at Castle Hill, and from 1805-1809 Commandant of Newcastle. From 1809 he concentrated on exploration and pastoral pursuits. Between 1817 and 1821 he made several important exploratory journeys south of Sydney and in the Goulburn and Canberra Districts. He was granted large tracts of land near Liverpool and Moss Vale and was responsible for the construction of the first road from Picton to the Goulburn He was Plains. appointed to the Legislative Council in 1825 and again in 1827.
