Statute No. 17



UNIVERSITY SEAL STATUTE 1992

Citation

1. This Statute may be cited as the University Seal Statute 1992.

Repeal

2. The College Seal Statute (Statute No. 1 of the Canberra College of Advanced Education) is repealed.

Definitions

3. In this Statute, unless the contrary intention appears:
"seal" means the seal of the University referred to in section 4 of the University Act.

Documents to which seal to be affixed

- 4. Where the Council has, under section 4 of the University Act, authorised the use of the seal on:
 - (a) the certificate or other like document (in this section called the "testamur") issued to a person as evidence that the person has been admitted to a degree, diploma or certificate of the University; and
 - (b) each Statute made by the Council; and
 - (c) any other document which is approved by the Council and which is required to be under the seal;

the Registrar must affix the seal to each such testamur, Statute or other document.

Affixing of seal to other documents

- 5. (1) Where a document, other than a document referred to in section 4, is required to be under the seal, the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor may, acting on behalf of the Council, direct the Registrar to affix the seal to that document.
 - (2) Where the seal is affixed under subsection (1) at the direction of the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor, the person giving the direction must, at the first opportunity, report to the Council the action so taken.
 - (3) Where the seal is affixed in accordance with this section, the affixing is taken to have been authorised by the Council.

Attestation

- 6. The affixing of the seal to any document must be attested by:
 - (a) the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor, and
 - (b) the Registrar.
