


PUBLIC PLACE NAMES ACT 1989

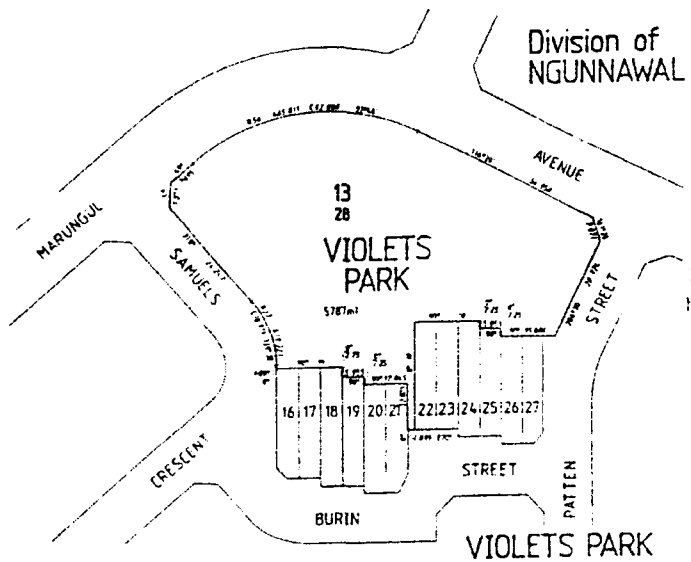
STREET NOMENCLATURE

DIVISION OF NGUNNAWAL: NOTABLE ABORIGINALS AND WORDS

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
VIOLETS PARK	Violet Bulger (1900-1993)	<p>Ngunnawal Elder. She was one of the Ngunnawal people's most respected elders. She was born in 1900 at the Brungle Mission. Her father was Fred Freeman, the well known "Black Tracker". She was one of the first native Australian children taken from their parents by Catholic Missionaries and placed in a children's home, where she trained as a domestic servant. She spent most of her working life in domestic services. After her marriage to Vincent Bulger, she gave birth to 10 children and raised many of her grandchildren after their parent's passed away. The family was moved to Hollywood, the aboriginal mission in Yass, in the 1930's and she was asked to work as the caretaker. She represented her community for several decades.</p>
