BARUNGA STREET

Albert Barunga (c.1910-1977)

Aboriginal Leader. Born Kunmunya, near Derby, WA, he was of the Worora tribe. He worked as a stockman at Barunga Mission and became fluent in english. He helped translate the gospels into the Worora language. In 1929 he helped Sir Charles Kingsford - Smith when he made a forced landing of the "Southern Cross" on the Glenelg River flats. He guided RAN vessels on coastal patrols and also worked with the Americans in WWII. In 1969 he joined the Aboriginal Theatre Foundation and later became President of the West Kimberley Branch. He was a leading councillor, active on several State and Federal Committees. He advocated friendship and harmony between the races.

Reg Saunders MBE (1920-1990)


Aborigine, Soldier. He was the first Aborigine to be commissioned an officer in the Australian Army. He served with the 6th Australian
