TOBACCO ACT 1927

EXEMPTION

NO. 42 OF 1994

Pursuant to subsections 10(3) and 12(4) of the *Tobacco Act 1927*, I TERENCE CONNOLLY, Minister for Health, HEREBY EXEMPT such contracts and agreements between the Australian Cricket Board Incorporated and The Benson and Hedges Company owned by WD and HO Wills (Australia) Limited as are in force at the date of this instrument, from the operation of subsections 10(1), 12(1) and 12(2) of the *Tobacco Act 1927* subject to the following conditions:

- (a) That the display of tobacco advertising shall be confined to four signs each measuring 7 metres long x 0.75 metres high which will be positioned on each side of the sight screen at both ends of the Manuka Oval in the Australian Capital Territory;
- (b) On one of the abovementioned signs located at each end of the Manuka Oval there shall be displayed a health warning which shall occupy not less than 25 per cent of the space of the sign. Within that space the Health Warning shall read.

SMOKING REDUCES YOUR FITNESS Health Authority Warning

(c) On the other of the abovementioned signs located at each end of the Manuka Oval there shall be displayed a Health Warning which shall occupy not less than 25 per cent of the space of the sign. Within that space the Health Warning shall read.

SMOKING CAUSES HEART DISEASE Health Authority Warning

- (e) The display of tobacco advertising referred to in paragraph (a) shall only occur during the conduct of a cricket match between the Prime Minister's XI and the English Cricket Team on 9 November, 1994, and
- (e) That the ACT Cricket Board Incorporated shall display four 9 metres long x 0.75 metres high anti-smoking signs with two of these signs
