

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY NATURE CONSERVATION ACT 1980 DECLARATION OF SPECIES INSTRUMENT NO. 192 OF 1998

Pursuant to section 21 of the *Nature Conservation Act 1980*, I revoke Instrument No. 7 of 1998 notified in Gazette No. S18 of 12 January 1998 and I declare that:

- (a) a species specified in:
 - (i) Schedule 1 is a vulnerable species; and
 - (ii) Schedule 2 is an endangered species, and
- (b) an ecological community specified in Schedule 3 is an endangered community.

Schedule 3 Endangered communities

Name of community	Description
Natural Temperate Grassland	A naturally occurring grassland of the temperate zone, dominated by native perennial tussock grasses, with associated native herbs and native fauna.
Yellow Box/Red Gum Grassy Woodland	A naturally occurring woodland of the temperate zone, in which Yellow Box co-occurs with Blakely's Red Gum. It includes the species rich understorey of native tussock grasses, herbs and scattered shrubs, together with a large number of native animal species.
