## STREET NOMENCLATURE

Division of Amaroo: Australian rivers and lakes

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Leven Street		A Tasmanian River. A northern Tasmanian river 96 kms long it rises in the north western highlands near Black Bluff and flows in a north-east direction at Ulverstone. The Leven and other rivers in the area were named after Scottish
Yule Street		and/or English Rivers. A Western Australian River. Named in 1861 by F.T. Gregory after an early colonial of Western Australia.
Augusta Place		A Tasmanian Lake. West of the Great Lake in central Tasmania.
Narran Street		A New South Wales River. A watercourse about 168 kms long, starting in Qld at the Ballone River, about 42 kms north-north east of Angledool in NSW, and flowing in a south westerly by south direction and draining in the Narran Lake.



A Northern Territory River. Katherine River was named by John McDouall Stuart in 1862 after Katherine Chambers, daughter of James Chambers who was one of the supporters of Stuart's third overland expedition; the river flows from its source in Arnhem Land in a south-easterly direction past the town of Katherine, which is named after the river, to the Daly River. A Queensland River. The Star River is a tributary of the Burdekin River - their confluence is 60kms north-west of Charters Towers, north-east Queensland. A Victorian River. The Bemm River is located in east Gippsland, Victoria, and flows into Sydenham Inlet, 15km east of Orbost A New South Wales River Tia River is a southern tributary of the Apsley River flowing into the Maclay River. It joins the main stream about 19
