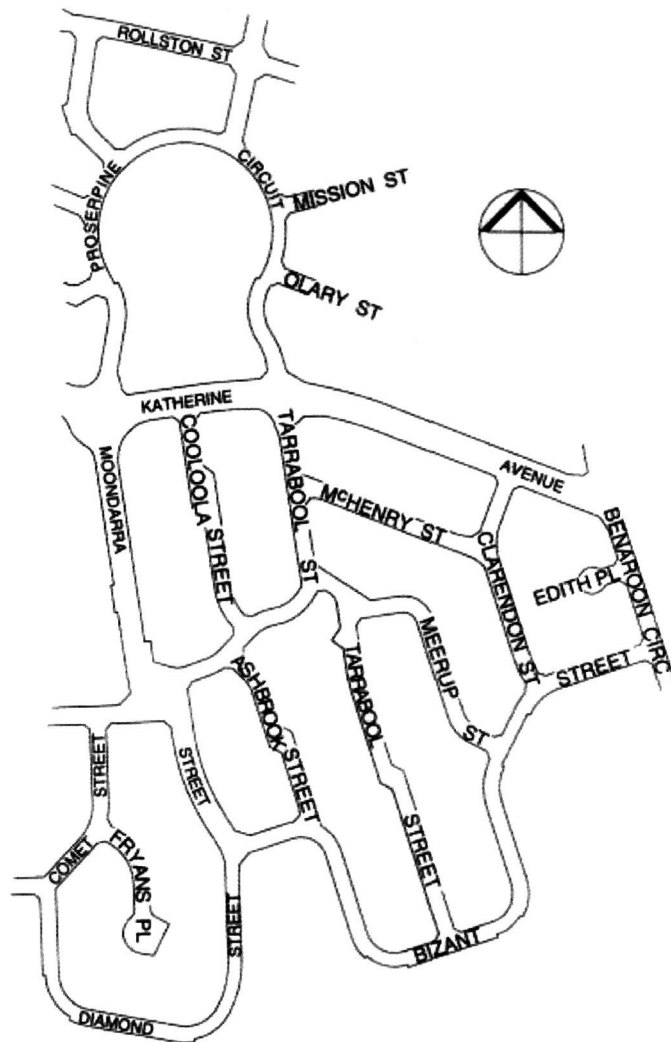

STREET NOMENCLATURE

Division of Amaroo: Australian Rivers and Lakes

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Cooloola Street	Cooloola Lake	Queensland freshwater lake near Noosa.
Ashbrook Street	Ashbrook Creek	Australian Capital Territory creek, at the top of the Tidbinbilla Valley, possibly named by George Green and George Hatfield who occupied the hut "Ash Corner", named because of the Alpine Ash found in the area.
Fryans Place	Fryans Lake	Victorian lake, near Halls Gap.
Tarrabool Street	Tarrabool River	Victorian river.
Mission Street	Mission River	Queensland river, named by John Douglas in 1895, enters the Gulf of Carpentaria at Weipa.
Olary Street	Olary Creek	South Australian creek.
McHenry Street	McHenry River	Queensland river, named by Frank and Alec Jardine in 1864 after John McHenry of "Arthur Downs".
Meerup Street	Meerup River	Western Australian river.
Clarendon Street	Clarendon Lake	Queensland lake.
Edith Place	Edith River	Northern Territory river, named during the construction of the Overland Telegraph Line (1871-1872) by William McMinn after Lady Edith Ferguson, the wife of the SA Governor.
Benaroon Circuit	Benaroon Lake	Queensland lake, on Fraser Island.
