		FORMULA FOR SHORT TERM	

FORMULA FOR SHORT TERM LICENSING PERIODS

Where

- A full licence is issued for a period other than five years, or
- A provisional licence is issued for a period other than three years,

The fee payable shall be the five year fee for a full licence divided by sixty and multiplied by the number of months for which the full or provisional licence is issued. Any part of a month shall be treated as one month.

Fees highlighted by asterisk (*) include 10% Goods and Services Tax
