

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Pellew Street	Charles Pellew (1891-1993)	Cricketer; right-handed batsman, brilliant fielder and later a fine coach; toured England with the AIF team in 1919, making 1,260 runs; in the 1920-21 series against England he made 319 runs from four Tests; toured England and South Africa in 1921-22; in 18 Sheffield Shield matches he made 1,343 runs; he was one of two brothers and two cousins to play cricket for South Australia.
