#### Name

1. This determination is the Attorney-General (Determination of Fees and Charges for 2003/2004) Amendment 2003 (No 2)\*.

3. This instrument amends the Determination of Fees and Charges for 2003/2004 – Attorney General (DI 2003-90) as amended.

#### Amendments

4. Insert a new 2B: “2B. Fees payable for a service in Schedule 2 for item 239 come into effect on 9 October 2003 or the day determination Attorney General (Determination of Fees and Charges for 2003/2004 (Amendment No 2) 2003 comes into effect, whichever is the later.”

5. Amend clause 5 of the instrument to delete “238” and insert “239”.

6. Amend Schedule 1 of the instrument to insert at the bottom of the table:
