
Ruth Alsop was Melbourne's first female architect. Ruth took up architecture at the age of 28 by being articled to her brother Rodney's firm of Klingender & Alsop. She worked with Klingender & Alsop until after the outbreak of war in 1915.

The onset of World War I and caring for her ailing parents curtailed her practice after that date. She later designed a house in Croydon for herself and her two unmarried sisters.

She remained a registered architect until 1927.
