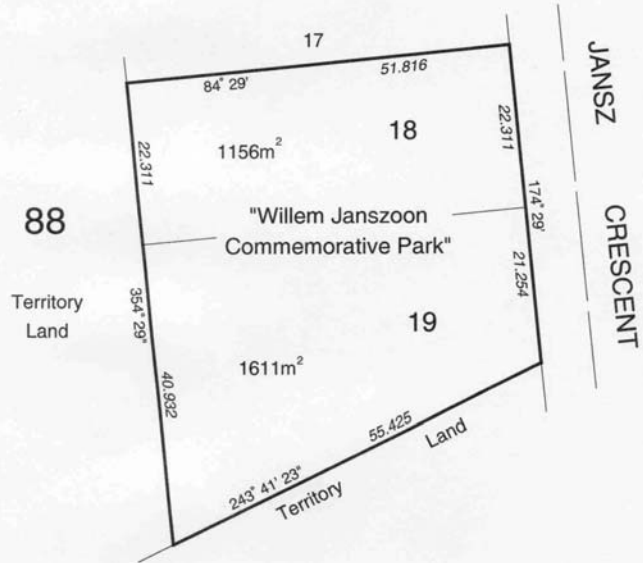

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Willem Janszoon Commemorative Park	Willem Janszoon (c.1570-after 1629)	<p>Explorer</p> <p>In 1606 Captain Willem Janszoon, in the vessel <i>Duyfken</i>, sailed into Australian waters. He was the first recorded European to do so.</p> <p>Captain Janszoon charted over 300 kilometres of the Australian coastline along the west coast of Cape York, Queensland, around March 1606. He sailed in the service of the first true multinational corporation in history, the Netherlands based Dutch East India Company.</p>
