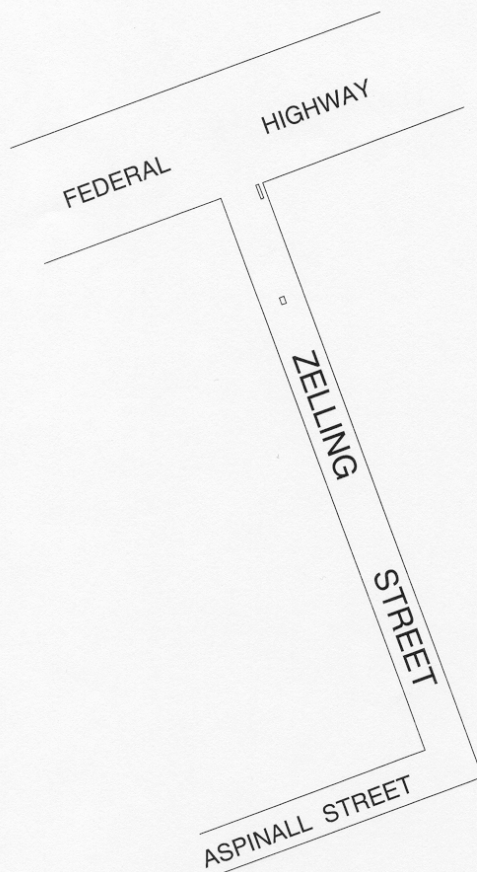

#### Division of Watson (*Judges and the legal profession*)

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Zelling Street	Sesca Ross Zelling (1918-2001)	<p>Australian Lawyer</p> <p>Sesca Ross Zelling was born in Wayville, South Australia. She studied Law at the University of Adelaide and, in 1941, was admitted to the Bar.</p> <p>From 1942 until 1947 Sesca was the prosecuting officer for the Deputy Commonwealth Crown Solicitor. She was appointed a Justice of the Peace in 1945.</p> <p>Sesca held many positions including: president of the Australian Federation of University Women, member of the Council of St Ann's College, member of the National Council of Women of South Australia (NCW) and president of that council (1957-1960). She was the third woman ever to be appointed to the Council of the University of Adelaide.</p> <p>Sesca was awarded the Order of the British Empire in 1960 for services to women and the community of South Australia. In 1970 she was appointed honorary life president of the SA division in recognition for her work with the National Council of Women.</p>
