		Blue Rock Dam is located on the Tanjil River in north Gippsland, 5 kilometres from the township of Willow Grove and 20 kilometres northwest of Moe.
		In 1979, the Victorian Government approved the construction of this dam on Tanjil River to regulate its flow and augment water supply to the Latrobe Valley.
		The dam was called "Blue Rock" after an early gold mine in the area.
		Construction began in October 1979 and was completed in 1984. The embankment rises 75 metres above the river bed.
