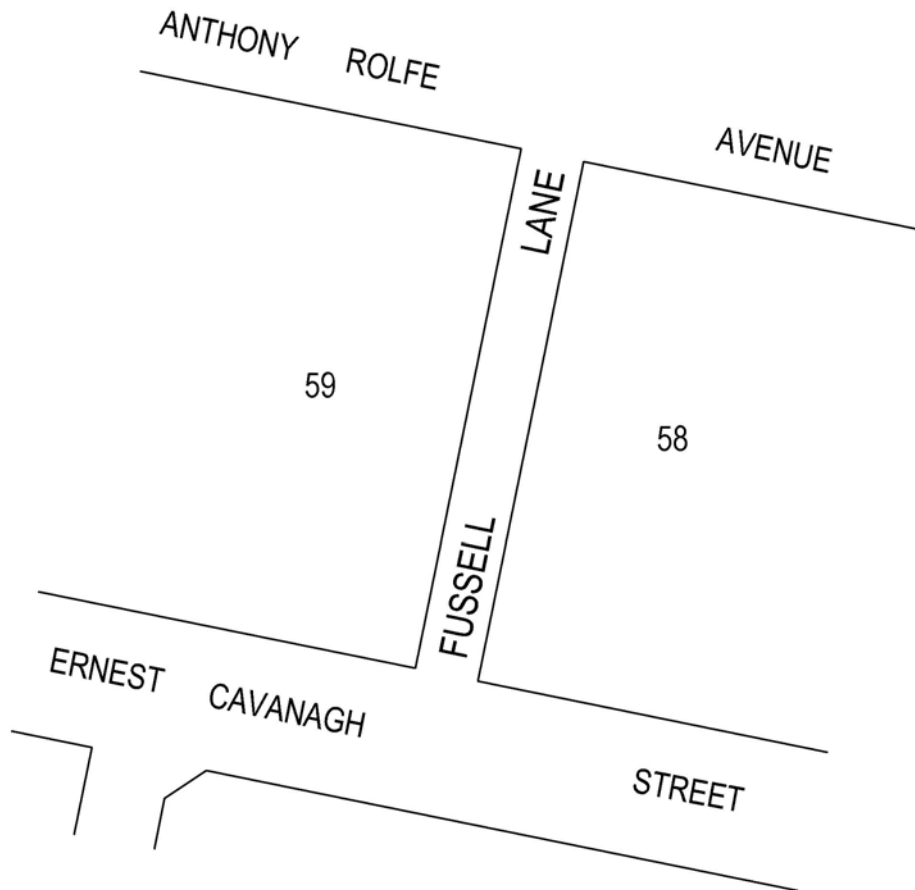

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Fussell Lane	Major Leslie George Fussell MC (1883-1960)	<p>Gunghalin Pioneer</p> <p>Leslie George Fussell was born in Ballarat, Victoria.</p> <p>He saw service in Gallipoli and France during the First World War in which time he achieved the rank of major. A diligent officer, he was awarded the Military Cross, was twice mentioned in Despatches and recommended for the Distinguished Service Order.</p> <p>Leslie came to Canberra after the war to take up an appointment as the manager of the Commonwealth Bank from 1921 to 1926. He laid out the first golf course and racetrack; and planted many gardens in Canberra.</p> <p>Major Fussell also had the honour of leading the Returned Services League section of the parade at the opening of Parliament in 1927.</p>
