Currong Street	Braddon and Reid	<p>Currong Street straddles Ainslie Avenue. Redevelopment of land which included part of Currong Street Reid severed the link between the two parts of the road. This has since caused address confusion.</p> <p>The separated parts of this road will be renamed with an additional identifier to provide unique address for residents.</p>
