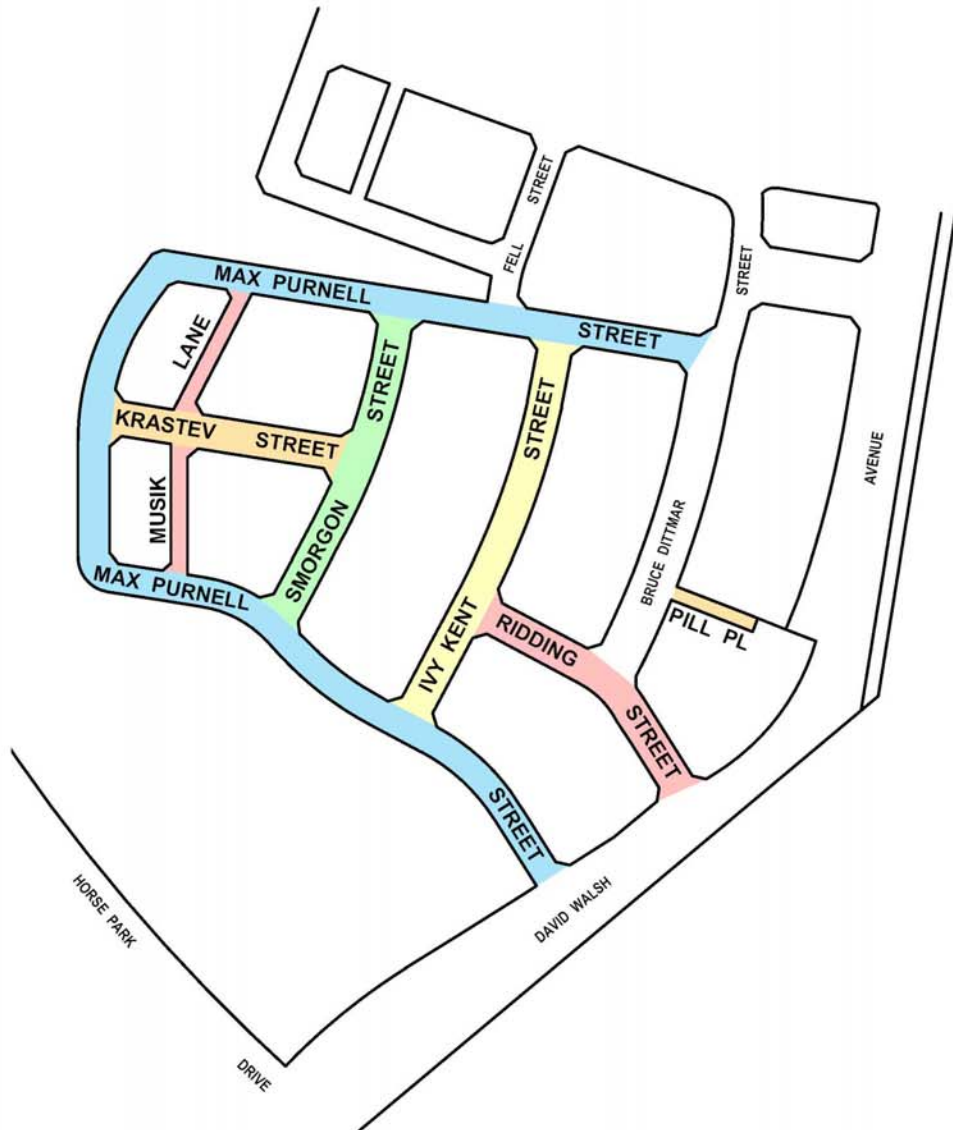
## SCHEDULE

### Public Place Names (Forde) Determination 2009 (No 2)

#### Division of Forde: *community service*

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
<b>Ivy Kent Street</b>	Ivy Mary Kent MBE JP (1890-1974)	Community service Western Australia.  A youth welfare worker, who set up a club for neglected girls during World War II, and was an active member of numerous community organisations. She became the first female commissioner of the ABC and was foundation president of the Association of Civilian Widows in WA and later national president.
<b>Krastev Street</b>	Irene Krastev OAM (1925-2000)	Community service South Australia.  Founding member of the Migrant Women's Lobby Group and voluntary participant in many areas of public life including local government, horticulture, health, business, housing, aged issues, ethnic affairs and women's affairs.
<b>Max Purnell Street</b>	David Maxwell Purnell AM MBE(C) (1916-2000)	Community service Canberra.  Following RAAF service in WWII, Max was an active member of the Canberra Repertory, the Philharmonic Society, YMCA, Rotary International, the Good Neighbour Council, Canberra Public Library Service, chairman of the Committee for Cultural Development, chairman of the Canberra Theatre Trust, and president of Goodwin Homes for the Aged.
<b>Musik Lane</b>	Anna Alexandra Musik (1924-2007)	Community service Canberra.  Polish migrant Anna Musik (which she simply pronounced as 'Music') settled in Canberra in 1951. Her WWII experiences left her with strong humanitarian values. She devoted much of her later life serving the ACT Red Cross in fundraising and voluntary roles visiting elderly European people in nursing homes comforting them in one of the six languages she spoke.

<b>Pill Place</b>	Ronald Harry Pill (1922-2006)	Community service Canberra.  Served in the AIF then RAAF as a pilot during WWII and settled in Canberra in 1948. Over three decades Ron Pill chalked up over 8000 hours of flying instruction for local residents through the Canberra Aero Club. He produced an operations manual for light aircraft training organisations and achieved an award for his outstanding contribution to the aero club movement of Australia.
<b>Ridding Street</b>	Ernest Francis Ridding GKN LLM (1927-2001)	Community service New South Wales.  Ernie the Fridge Man repaired and recycled refrigerators and other whitegoods, as well as early model computers for free distribution to thousands of disadvantaged needy people in the Glebe Estate and many Sydney suburbs.
<b>Smorgon Street</b>	Roslyn Frances Smorgon AM (1949-2008)	Community service Victoria.  Fundraiser and supporter of a range of Jewish, women's health, arts and sporting organisations including Mount Scopus College, Monash University Foundation for Jewish Studies, Breast Cancer Network Australia, Footscray Community Arts Centre and Western Bulldogs AFL Club.
