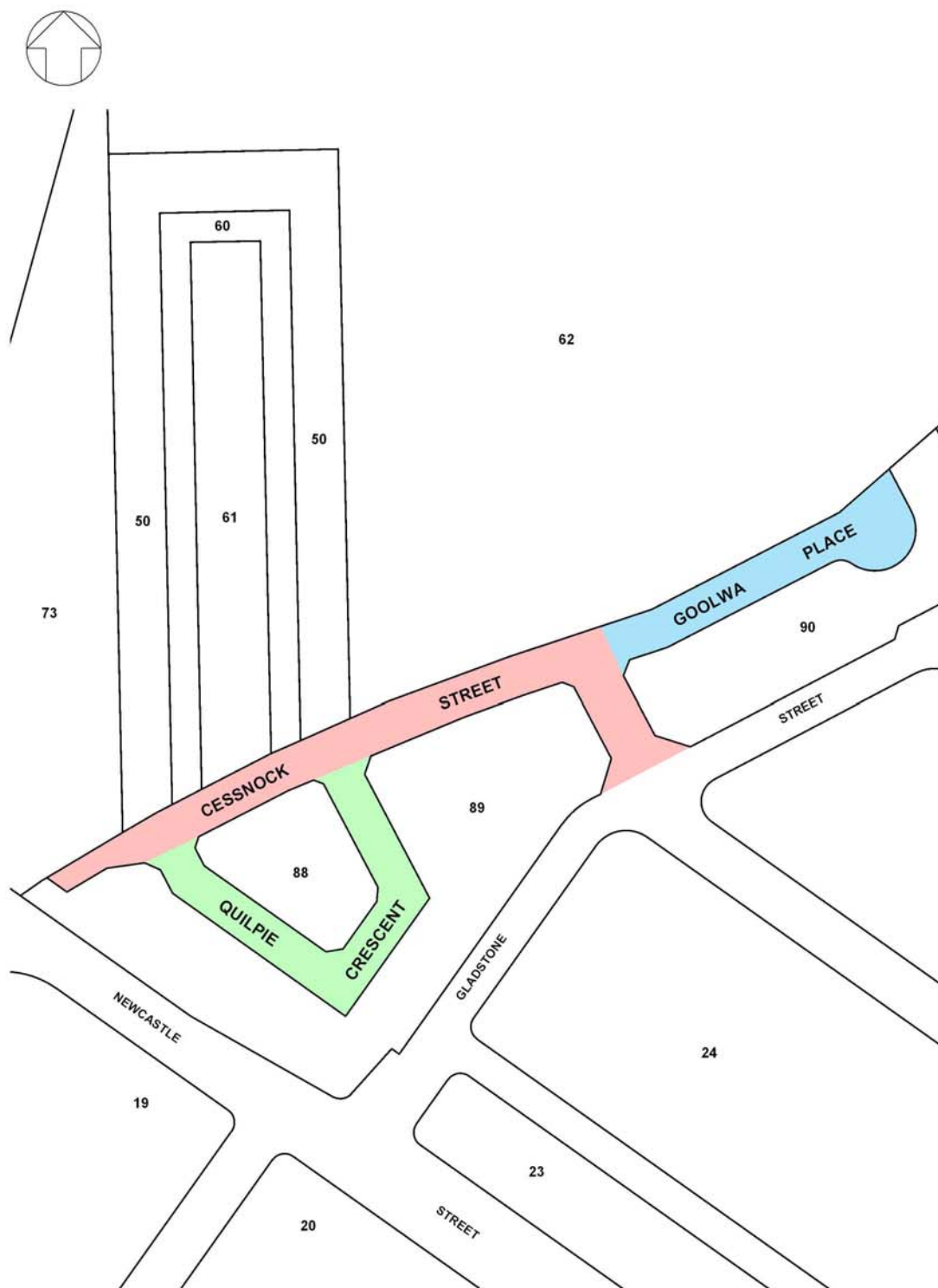

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Cessnock Street	Cessnock, NSW	<p>NSW industrial town</p> <p>Cessnock is located in the Hunter Valley, NSW. It is known for its agriculture and coal mining. The Hunter Valley wine-growing area near Cessnock is Australia's oldest wine region.</p>
Goolwa Place	Goolwa, SA	<p>SA industrial town</p> <p>Goolwa is located at the mouth of the Murray River on the western shore of Lake Alexandrina. Goolwa, a river port is listed as a heritage site due to the town's contribution to inland development and maritime commerce.</p>
Quilpie Crescent	Quilpie, Qld	<p>Qld industrial town</p> <p>Quilpie is located in western Queensland. It is recognised as an opal mining town and is the largest producer of boulder opals in the world. As well as being an industrial mining town, Quilpie has a rich history in grazing and agriculture, primarily cattle and sheep grazing.</p>
