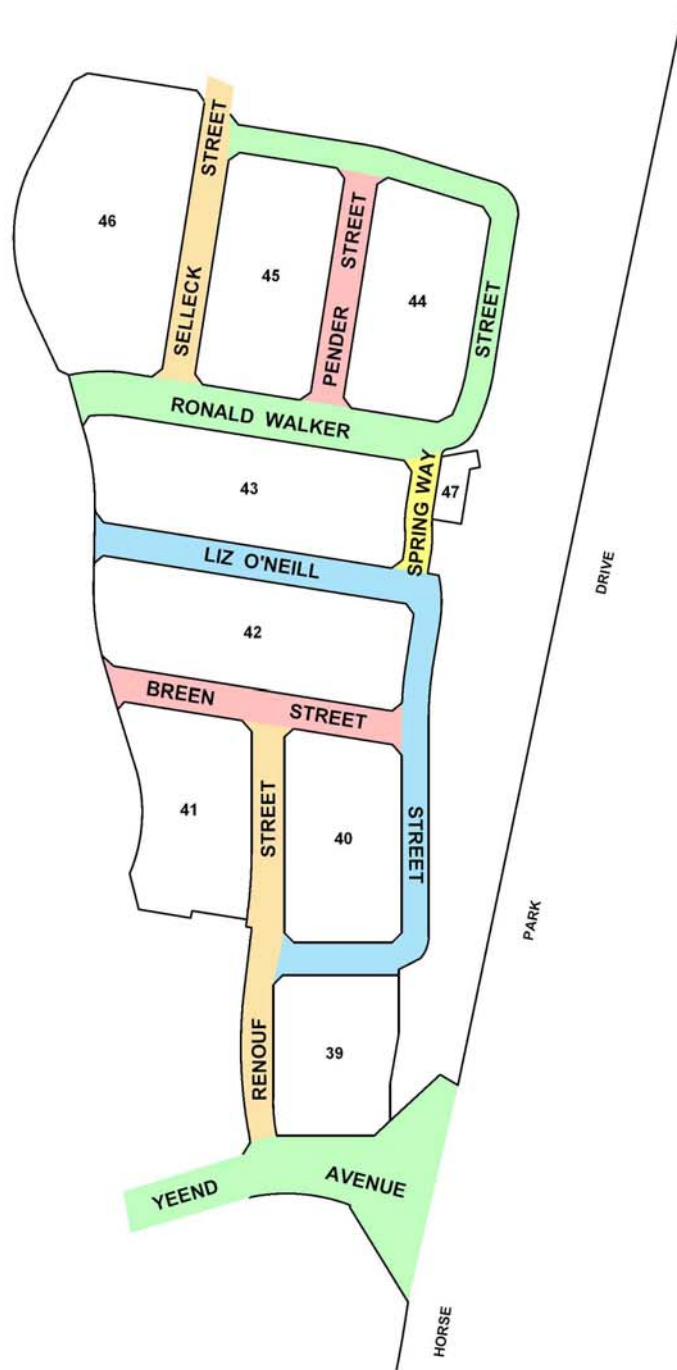

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Breen Street	Rae Josephine Breen PSM (1927-2005)	Public service with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia for 46 years, achieving appointment in that bank as the first female branch manager in 1979 and first female branch inspector in 1985.
Liz O'Neill Street	Elizabeth Josephine O'Neill OAM (1969-2007)	Australian public service, diplomat - Australian Counsellor for Public Affairs, Indonesia.
Pender Street	Beryl Elizabeth Pender (1902-1974)	Queensland public service, administrator, Queensland superintendent of the Australian Women's Land Army.
Renouf Street	Alan Philip Renouf OBE (1919-2008)	Australian public service, Secretary of the Department of Foreign Affairs, diplomat - Australian High Commissioner to Nigeria, Ambassador to Yugoslavia, France and the United States.
Ronald Walker Street	Sir (Edward) Ronald Walker CBE PhD LittD DSc (1907-1988)	Australian public service, diplomat, economist. Professor of Economics at the University of Tasmania, 1939-1946, and later Australian Ambassador to Japan, the United Nations (New York), France, Germany, and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.
Selleck Street	Austin Joseph Selleck AM (1926-2009)	Australian public service for 45 years, manager Defence Service Homes Corporation.
Spring Way	Jane Vivien Spring PSM (1941-2003)	Australian public service, staff member of the Australia Council for the Arts - Music Board, Community Arts Board, and Policy and Planning Division.
Yeend Avenue	Sir Geoffrey John Yeend AC, CBE (1927-1994)	Australian public service, head of Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet, Chancellor Australian National University.
