1 Name of instrument

This Instrument is the Road Transport (Public Passenger Services) Regular Route Services Maximum Fares Determination 2010 (No 1)

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on 1 July 2010.

3 Revocation of previous determination

The Road Transport (Public Passenger Services) Regular Route Services Maximum Fares Determination 2009 (No 3) (Disallowable Instrument DI2009-201) is revoked.

4 Determination of maximum fares

The maximum fares payable on regular route services provided by ACTION are set out in the schedule, part A.

5 Definitions and validity arrangements for ticket types and eligibility conditions for discounted fares

Definitions and validity arrangements for ticket types and eligibility conditions for discounted fares for regular route services provided by ACTION are set out in the schedule, part B.

6 Payment of Fee

A fee to which this determination applies is payable by a person using a bus service operated by ACTION and is payable to ACTION or an authorised agent of ACTION.

Part B: Definitions and validity arrangements for ticket types and eligibility conditions for discounted fares

Definitions and validity arrangements for ticket types

Cash – a paper receipt issued on boarding a regular route service that allows a person to complete a journey on that vehicle.

Transfer (cash) – when purchased, upon boarding a regular route service, allows a person to transfer to another bus or buses free of charge provided this occurs within 90 minutes of first validating the ticket on the first bus.

Faresaver 10 – provides 10 journeys on regular route services and includes a transfer free of further charge to another bus or buses provided this occurs within 90 minutes of validating the ticket on the first bus.

Student Faresaver 10 – provides 10 journeys for eligible students on regular and school route services within the period of a school term, not including a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday and includes a transfer free of further charge to another bus or buses provided this occurs within 90 minutes of validating the ticket on the first bus.

Daily – provides unlimited travel on regular route services on the day the ticket is validated.

Shoppers off-peak daily – applies on the day when the ticket is validated and provides unlimited travel on weekdays between 9.00 am to 4.30 pm and after 6 pm, and all day Saturday, Sunday and public holidays on regular route services.

The schedule

Concession off-peak daily – applies on the day when the ticket is validated and provides unlimited travel on weekdays between 9.00 am to 4.30 pm and after 6 pm, and all day Saturday, Sunday and public holidays on regular route services.

Weekly – provides unlimited travel on regular route services for a period of seven (7) days commencing on the day the ticket is first validated.

Monthly – provides unlimited travel on regular route services during a period of a month commencing on the day the ticket is first validated.

School Term – provides an eligible student with unlimited travel within a period of a school term but not including a Saturday, a Sunday or a public holiday.

A **journey** by a passenger on a bus operating on a regular route service is taken to have been completed when the passenger alights from the bus or when the bus completes the scheduled route service, whichever occurs first.

Eligibility conditions for discounted fares

A person is eligible for a **concession fare** if—

- (a) the person is an ACT resident and holds one of the following concession cards:
 - (i) a card issued by Centrelink or the Department of Veterans' Affairs commonly known as a "Pensioner Concession Card";
 - (ii) an ACTION Concession Card issued by Centrelink based on the person holding a "Health Care Card Low Income" or a "Health Care Card";
 - (iii) a Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card;
- (b) the person is the holder of a Seniors Card issued by any Australian State or Territory;
- (c) the person attends a primary school; or
- (d) the person holds an appropriate student card identifying the person as—
 - (i) a secondary school or college student; or
 - (ii) a full time student attending an accredited tertiary education institution, not including a member of the Defence Force and who undertakes at least 15 hours per week class time.

A person is eligible for a **student fare** if the person is—

- (a) a primary school student attending an ACT school;
- (b) a student registered for home schooling under the Education Act 2004; or
- (c) a student who holds an appropriate student card identifying the person as a secondary school or college student attending an ACT school.

The schedule

A person is an *exempt person* if the person is—

- (a) an ACT resident who holds a Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card embossed with TPI or EDA and, where that person is accompanied by an attendant, the attendant;
- (b) an interstate resident who holds a Department of Veterans' Affairs Gold Card embossed with TPI or EDA and has applied for and been approved as an exempt person, and where that person is accompanied by an attendant, the attendant;
- (c) a World War I veteran;
- (d) a World War I veteran's spouse, or a person who was, at the time of the veteran's death, living with the veteran as the veteran's spouse on a permanent and bona fide basis although not legally married to the veteran;
- (e) wearing or displaying war service medals on the 25th day of April in any year;
- (f) during Seniors Week on Monday to Friday between 9.00am and 4.30pm and after 6.00pm – a person who holds an ACT Seniors Card;
- (g) any person on the 25th day of December in any year;
- (h) a person who has been assessed as legally blind and holds a vision impaired pass or an ACTION vision impaired annual ticket and, where that person is accompanied by an attendant, the attendant;
- (j) a person who has not attained the age of five years, is not occupying a seat in the bus and is in the care and custody of a person apparently over the age of eight years who assures the driver or inspector that the first mentioned person has not attained the age of five years;
- (k) a sworn member of ACT Policing (Australian Federal Police) in their official capacity and who holds evidence which identifies him or her as such a person;
- (l) an ACT resident who has attained the age of 75 years and who has been issued with an ACTION Gold Card; or
- (m) a resident of Oaks Estate who either:
 - (i) provides proof of one way travel on a Deane's Buslines service that occurred within 90 minutes prior to the resident travelling on an ACTION service; or
 - (ii) provides proof of return travel on Deane's Buslines services that has occurred or will occur on the same day of travel as the resident's travel on an ACTION service; and
- (n) the companion of a person holding a Companion Card issued by an Australian State or Territory Government.
