

NAME Roden Cutler Drive	ORIGIN Sir Arthur Roden Cutler VC, AK, KCMG, KCVO, CBE (1916-2002)	Soldier, Victorian Cross recipient, diplomat and Governor of NSW Sir Roden was awarded the Victoria Cross for exceptional courage against the enemy during the capture of the Syrian town of Merdjayoun in June 1941. After World War II Sir Roden had a successful career in the diplomatic service where he served as High Commissioner to New Zealand (1946-52), Ceylon (1952-55) and Pakistan (1959-61), Australian Consul-General in New York (1961-65), Delegate to the United Nations General Assembly (1963, 1964) and Ambassador to the Netherlands
		(1965-66). From 1966 to 1981 he served as Governor of NSW, the longest serving appointee to that office. Sir Roden was the president of the Scouts Association (NSW) and gave much of his time to numerous charities in a voluntary capacity.
