1 Name of instrument

This instrument is the *Nature Conservation (Special Protection Status)* Declaration 2012 (No 2).

2 Commencement

This instrument commences on the day after notification.

3 Declaration

I declare:

- (1) members of the species of migratory animal to which any of the agreements listed in the attached schedule 1 apply to have special protection status for the purposes of section 33 (1) of the *Nature Conservation Act 1980* (Nature Conservation Act).
- (2) members of the following species of native animal and native plant to have special protection status for the purposes of section 33 (2) (a) of the Nature Conservation Act:
 - (a) species listed by the Minister (Cwlth) as threatened for the purposes of section 178 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Cwlth) immediately before the commencement of this instrument; and
 - (b) species listed in the attached schedule 2.
- (3) members of the species of native animal or native plant listed in the attached schedule 3 to have special protection status for the purposes of section 33 (2) (b) of the Nature Conservation Act.

4 Revocation

The disallowable instrument *Nature Conservation (Special Protection Status) Declaration 2012* DI2012-38 is revoked.
